# North River Farms Tree Planting

A total of 129,000 trees, including bald cypress, swamp black gum, water tupelo, green ash and a variety of oaks, were planted on 442 acres at the North River Farms wetland restoration site. The

project is converting agricultural land back to wetlands with the goal of reducing runoff and reopening shellfish waters. It is one of the nation's largest restoration projects.

The Coastal Resources Commission (CRC), a governor-appointment commission that provides guidance for coastal management, met in Nags Head on Feb. 26 and 27. It voted to remove the inlet hazard area designation for <u>Mad Inlet</u> over the objections of the Town of Sunset Beach and the federation.


