Study Reveals Potential Threats To Groundwater



The federation released a

long-awaited analysis of the potential effects of the proposed Titan cement plant upon the region's groundwater resources. Titan America wants to build one of the largest cement manufacturing and strip mine facilities in the nation on the shores of the Northeast Cape Fear River.

Curtis Consolvo, president of Geo-Resources and a licensed geologist, prepared the report that describes serious potential issues - from sink holes to reduced water supplies. UNCW Geologist Roger Shew and State Representative Rick Catlin expressed serious concerns about Titan's potential to negatively affect our groundwater resources after reviewing the report.
