Coastal Federation's Video to Air at Natty Greene's

RALEIGH - The N.C. Coastal Federation is bringing its award-winning video to Natty Greene's Pub & Brewing Co. in Raleigh on Thursday, March 14. The screening of Habitats, Heroes and Hallelujah: Stories of Hope from the North Carolina Coast is free and open to the public.

The event runs from 6:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. and guests are invited to join federation staff for Dutch treat hors d'oeuvres, dinner or beverages in Natty Greene's before the video that begins at 7 p.m. Natty Greene's is at 505 W. Jones Street and has plenty of parking behind the pub.

The federation's 40-minute video was produced by UNCW Television through the university's Division for Public Service and Continuing Studies. The video highlights some of the North Carolina coast's most beautiful and productive areas, and profiles everyday people who have helped to save these special places. The video is narrated by Bland Simpson, an author, songwriter and federation board member, and it takes viewers to the pocosins on the northeast coast, up the White Oak River on the central coast and to the pristine beaches of Bird Island near the S.C. line.

"We think it's important for people to understand that anyone can make a difference," explains Todd Miller, the federation's executive director. "That's what this video is all about. Fishermen, teachers, businessmen, farmers, and property owners join together to face environmental challenges that result in better communities and healthier coastal resources." The video won a 2012 Telly Award, a national award that recognizes excellence in film production. The federation will be offering a bonus for guests. Anyone joining the federation during the event can purchase a membership at a special \$15 rate, saving \$20 over the usual fee.
